Safeguarding Children who are 'Out of Sight' is Everyone's Business' Focusing on children who are Elective Home Educated (EHE)

Razia Butt, Education Advisor, Birmingham City Council delivered a PowerPoint <u>presentation</u> with the purpose of providing an overview of EHE and the procedures in Birmingham which focuses on supporting home educated children who are vulnerable.

She hopes that by sharing this information practitioners will have a greater understanding of the EHE process and how, by working effectively in partnership, we can safeguard the education and ensure positive outcomes for vulnerable children.
